

Scouts (not adults) cook a meal with an International Theme.? Very simple and everybody should be able to participate, that is, it's not limited to Dutch Ovens this year.? Very open.

**Rules are:**

- ❖ There will be a Dinner cooking competition on Saturday evening.
- ❖ The only requirement is the meal must be prepared (cooked) exclusively by Scouts using either propane stoves or over a charcoal fire which includes grilling and Dutch Ovens. (Beverages served with the meal are the exception.)
- ❖ Meals should follow an International Theme which is the choice of the Scouts.? Some themes could be American Western, Island Luau, Italian Caf&#39712;French Bistro, German Aprilfest or Merry Old England.? Food cooked should be in keeping with the theme and presented in a style of the theme.
- ❖ Meals should be balanced with a main ingredient and at least two side ingredients.? For example, pot roast with potatoes and carrots, or pizza with garlic bread and an Italian salad.
- ❖ Participating patrols should bring their meal to the staff area for judging at the time indicated on the schedule.
- ❖ Each patrol member should have played an active role in the preparation of the meal and be able to discuss with the judges their role in planning and preparing the meal.
- ❖ There will be a minimum of five judges, so plan accordingly when presenting your meals.

**Points will be awarded based on:**

15 = Creativity/Originality

30 = Taste

20 = Presentation

20 = Meal Completeness/Balance

15 = Cleanliness/Hygiene
